What is SBB?

Catering to Your Child's Abilities, Strengths and Talents Every child is unique, and has different aptitudes, capabilities and talents. We believe in providing a <u>balanced education</u> that <u>caters to the different abilities</u> of each child so that we can <u>prepare</u> <u>him or her for life</u>.

Subject-based Banding (Primary) was introduced as a refinement to the streaming process to <u>help each</u> <u>child realise his or her potential,</u> <u>based on his or her strengths</u> <u>and needs.</u>






Why Introduce SBB?

- Offers students the option of Standard and Foundation Subjects, depending on their strengths.
 - allow students to focus on and stretch their potential in the subjects they are strong while
 - <u>building the fundamentals</u> in the subject their need more support in

How does SBB Work?

Primary 4

Parents' Decision

School's Decision

- Your child sits for the school-based exams.
 - School recommends a subject combination based on child's exam results at the end of the year.
 - **<u>Parents</u> fill up an option form** indicating your child's preferred subject combination.

Primary 5

- Child takes subject combination chosen by parents.
 - <u>School</u> assesses child's ability to cope with the current subject combination at the end of the year.
- Adjustments to the number of standard and foundation subjects can be made, if needed.

Primary 6

• Child takes subject combination <u>decided by school</u> and sits for the Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE) at the end of Primary 6.



What are the Available Options?

Child's Results at END of P4	Child may be recommended to take
Passes all 4 subjects	4 standard subjects:
	 English Language
or	 Mother Tongue Language
	 Mathematics
Passes at least in 3 subjects	○ Science
Passes 4 subjects and does very well in Mother Tongue Language	4 standard subjects + Higher Mother Tongue Language
Pass 2 or fewer subjects	 3 standard subjects + 1 foundation subject 2 standard subjects + 2 foundation subjects
	 1 standard subject + 3 foundation subjects
	 4 foundation subjects

At END of P5: Students generally continue with the same subject combination in P6 unless they perform poorly in one or more subjects at P5.





Important Factors to Consider

- School will continue to recommend based on the following:
- Your child's aptitude, motivation and performance for each subject;
- Your child's ability to cope with a particular subject combination; and
- Primary School focuses on building a strong foundation in literacy and numeracy.
 Thus, the subject combination offered should help the child build this foundation.

Important Factors to Consider


Parents to consider the following when deciding:

- Understand your child's abilities and needs;
- Understand the scoring system for PSLE;
- Understand the different future pathways available for your child and the requirements

Important Factors to Consider

Offering subjects at the foundation level is <u>not a</u> <u>disadvantage to your child</u>

- enables him/her to focus on building up strong fundamentals in these subjects and
- better prepares him/her for progression to secondary school



Higher Mother Tongue

- Your child's ability to cope with Mother Tongue and the other subjects (EL, Maths & Science)
- HMT students are required
 - to stay for an extra 1h and 45 min of curriculum time after school;
 - o manage additional homework and
 - sit for one additional paper (HMT) at P5 exams & Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE)
- Remedial classes for HMT students will not be provided as they are expected to meet the minimum standards in MT proficiency



Higher Mother Tongue

- To continue to be offered HMT in P6, your child will have to meet the criteria of obtaining:
 - at least an AL4 (75% and above) in EL, Maths, Science and MTL
 - o a pass in HMT
 - at the end of P5
- Studying HCL does not guarantee entry into Special Assistance Plan (SAP) schools*. Students are still required to attain the entry requirements for SAP schools

* Note SAP schools offer only Chinese Language as Mother Tongue

Higher Mother Tongue

For your child to take HMTL in secondary school, he/she should meet

the following criteria:

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i. An overall PSLE score of 8 or better


<u>Or</u>

- ii. An overall PSLE score of 9 to 14 (inclusive) and attain
 - AL1 / AL2 in MTL or
 - Distinction/Merit in HMTL

HCL Posting Advantage for Entry to SAP Schools

Students will be ranked taking into account their performance in HCL.

This posting advantage applies before the tie-breakers for S1 posting.

SBB & Secondary School Admission

- Progression to secondary level depends on your child's PSLE score
- The different expectations of standard and foundation subjects will be taken into account when your child's PSLE score is calculated
- If he/she excels in his/her subjects, he/she will have the opportunity to pursue higher-level options at secondary school level
